awarded a special citation from the United States Treasury Department in recognition of the large number of war bonds she had sold.

She lived during her Detroit business years at the Priscilla Inn, a hotel for young business women. There she was "Mom" to many of the girls.

The last year of her life she spent in Mansfield, Ohio, in the home of her daughter, Ruth. Eva, one of 15 children, had been told by her mother that she was the "merry one." Her ability to see God and beauty in a flower, a bird or a tree, plus her unusual vitality kept her young and merry until she passed on August 19, 1949. She rests in the Moorhead family lot in Oakland Cemetery, Indiana, Pennsylvania.
